We just held our Memorial Mass and Annual Meeting which once again included our auction and fundraiser. It was a wonderful and very successful event. I hope you were able to attend.





From our Spiritual Advisor....



Dear Members of the Christ Child Society of Pasadena,

Greetings in Christ! I hope you all had a joyful Christmas and New Year and are healthy and staying strong. It was wonderful to see so many of you at the Memorial Mass on May 11th and then the auction and luncheon which followed at Annandale Golf Club. I'm delighted that it was such a great success!

As I write this, we are still celebrating the beautiful Easter Season which will soon close with the Solemnity of Pentecost. However, following that Sunday the next two Sundays are also very special. The first is Holy Trinity Sunday followed by the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord known as Corpus Christi.

This year Corpus Christi Sunday takes on an added importance as it falls during the year of Eucharistic Revival called for by the Bishops of the United States. The Archdiocese is recommending that all parishes have a Eucharistic procession that Sunday and we are doing that here at St. Andrew's after the 5:00 p.m. Sunday Mass on June 11th. Everyone is invited.

The reason for the Eucharistic Revival called for by the Bishops is to bring about greater faith and devotion to the Most Holy Eucharist. It is in this Blessed Sacrament that we encounter our Lord truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity under the appearance of bread and wine. In the course of the last 5 decades or so, Eucharistic piety such as processions, 40-Hour Devotions, Benediction, etc. seemed to have become neglected. As a result, belief in the Real Presence of Christ has also declined. This is alarming since this belief is a hallmark of the Catholic Faith. I encourage you to read the small book entitled "This is My Body" by Bishop Robert Barron. It was written specifically to clarify Church teaching on the Eucharist and help bring about the Eucharistic renewal. We are giving it away for free at our parish and it is also available from WordonFire.com for just \$2.00. I strongly recommend it.

The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The actual feast this year falls on June 16th but the whole month is dedicated to the Sacred Heart. In our increasingly secular and even anti-religious society, this devotion to the Love and Mercy of Christ is particularly urgent.

I hope you all have a relaxing and peaceful summer and I look forward to seeing you at our Fall Mass.

May the love of the Holy Child Jesus always compel us to serve!






Celebrating Friendship and Faith

Stations of the Cross Through the Eyes of Mary





There is a stained-glass window by the artist Harvey Salvin dedicated to Mary Virginia Merrick at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., the largest Roman Catholic church in North America.

The subject of the stained-glass window is that of the Blessed Virgin at Nazareth with Jesus and includes the text *"He was subject to them."*

The window which is located at the stairhall landing of the east nave, was donated by the Christ Child Society to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Mary Virginia Merrick's birthday.

Below is a photo and blurb about the window and the dedication featured in the 1967 May issue of "Mary's Shrine".
